- **d2w biodegradable** – ensuring that plastics safely biodegrade, leaving no microplastics behind
- **NbR technology** – to reduce the fossil-derived content of plastic by 20%
- **Rodent repellents** – to prevent rats and mice damaging plastic products, including the sheathing of electric cables. There have been many reports recently of these pests getting into the engine-compartments of vehicles and causing costly damage to the wiring
- **Vapour corrosion inhibitors**- to prevent rusting and other forms of corrosion of packaged products
- **Ethylene and odour adsorbers** – to keep food fresher for longer
- **Fragrances** – to neutralise the smell of recycled plastic

The continued engagement and enthusiasm from visitors throughout the show highlighted a clear market trend toward sustainable and high-performance plastic solutions—a trend that aligns perfectly with Symphony's strategic direction.
